SCHOOL GROWTH

2023 has been a year of extraordinary growth for Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School. While the school community is no stranger to expansion, with the merger of the two previously separate schools in 2017 and the addition of the Early Learning Center in 2021, the 2023-2024 academic year has seen the highest enrollment numbers in a decade, with an influx of 330 new students campus-wide.

In saddening succession, three Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of Boston announced their imminent closure in the latter half of the 2022-2023 school year: St. Joseph's Prep in February, Mount Alvernia in March, and Cambridge Matignon in May. The devastating news suddenly left hundreds of students and their families scrambling to find a new plan for completing their high school education.

In the wake of the closures, 250 new students

were enrolled at Arlington Catholic High School (ACHS) for 2023-2024. While the school closures were the catalyst that brought these new students to our doors, they did not end up at ACHS by accident. Director of Enrollment, Patricia Crane, in collaboration with the rest of the ACHS administration, worked tirelessly to find a space for as many of these displaced students as possible. Outreach to the families of the displaced students began promptly after the announcement of each closure.

Great efforts were made to empathize with their circumstance, address their fears and concerns, answer their questions, and provide as much support through the expedited admissions process they had inadvertently been thrust into. Additional open houses, shadow days, tours, and other information sessions were organized to provide families with the information needed to discern if ACHS was the right fit for them.

TRANSFER ORIENTATION NIGHT









The largest and final of these events was a "Transfer Orientation Night" held on June 20, with over 100 students and their families in attendance.

The evening kicked off with students and families hearing from Chaplain Father Chris Boyle, Principal John Graceffa, and Director of Enrollment, Patricia Crane. The gymnasium was set up with booths for each of the sports teams, student organizations, and clubs/extracurricular activities that Arlington Catholic High School offers. The administrative team was present to answer questions from students and parents. National Honor Society students led guided tours of the school building. Present in the library was Technology Coordinator/ Librarian Kelly Seibel and Director of IT Nick Parisi to provide information about student email addresses and school technology, as well as representatives from Donnelly's Uniform Company to take measurements, assist with sizing, and help place uniform orders. The school store, which

was open for students to purchase school apparel, continuously had a line out the door for the entire night. When guests wanted a break from all of the activity inside, they could go outside for some fresh air and get a complimentary frozen treat from the ice cream truck stationed outside the library.

The growth did not end with the student population. To maintain our individualized learning model, eight new faculty members were welcomed into the school community in order to produce more class sections to accommodate the larger student body.

Even as our enrollment numbers rise and our facilities continue to grow in order to provide a quality Catholic school education to a greater number of students, our close-knit and engaging community remains. We look forward to students growing up with us on Medford Street, from infancy to Grade 12, for many years to come.

INAUGURAL SCHOOL PRESIDENT

WELCOME, DR. ANDREW KEOUGH

In order to meet the demands of both a growing school population and the increasing workload facing the Catholic Parishes of Arlington, Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School made the decision in 2019 to begin the process of transitioning to a President- Principal administrative model. The process was conducted in collaboration with Partners in Mission, a full-service consulting and professional education firm focused exclusively on developing excellence in Catholic school advancement and leadership. They led a detailed search process resulting in the selection of Dr. Andrew W. Keough as the Inaugural President of Saint Agnes School/ Arlington Catholic High School. The search committee was impressed with Dr. Keough's extensive experience with strategic planning, his passion for serving others, his commitment to faith formation, and his sincere love of children.

Since his integration into the Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School community in July of 2023 as the President, Dr. Keough has prioritized listening and learning from fellow administrators, faculty, staff, and families. He has been dedicated to learning as much about the history and inner workings of the school as possible in order to guide and inform the Strategic Plan for the Office of the President, as well as the school at large.

Over the course of his career as an educator, Dr. Keough has worked in both public and Catholic schools. His experience includes serving as a high school principal of Medfield High School (2003-2007) and Wellesley High School (2007-2014), and as school superintendent in the Easton Public Schools (2014-2017) and Dover Sherborn Regional Schools (2017-2021). His transition into Catholic education was marked by his appointment as the Interim Principal of Rice Memorial High School in South Burlington, Vermont. Having that comparison has only strengthened his admiration and appreciation for Catholic education, and his dedication to ensuring the SAS/ ACHS community achieves the fullest realization of its Catholic mission.

When asked about his transition to the SAS/ACHS community, Dr. Keough was effusive in his praise: "These two schools are truly special. Rather than preparing and smoothing the path of life for their students, our schools prepare the students themselves for the path of life, both spiritually and intellectually." He continued: "Providing our students with a solid academic and social experience is important here. However, equally important is ensuring that each child has a strong faith foundation; one which provides them with the tools and courage necessary to navigate

the unavoidably choppy waters of adolescence. Sadly, faith formation is not a priority in schools today and as a result, students are suffering. It's great to be part of the effort to improve the lives of young people, beyond academics and athletics.... I know 'talk is cheap,' but at Saint Agnes School and Arlington Catholic High School, we actually really do educate the 'whole person', and it shows in the joy and sense of peace on our students' faces, day in and day out."





CHAPLAIN

WELCOME, FR. CHRIS BOYLE









In June of 2023, Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School was blessed with the addition of a new high school chaplain, Fr. Chris Boyle. Prior to his position as chaplain of Arlington Catholic High School, Fr. Chris served as chaplain of South Boston Catholic Academy. He began his journey with Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School (SAS/ACHS) by celebrating Mass with our high school students. At the end of Mass, our Campus Ministry presented Fr. Chris with an ACHS sweatshirt to officially welcome him into the Cougar family!

Fr. Chris is a South Shore native and one of thirteen children in an Irish Catholic family. From a young age he was an altar server at Resurrection Parish in his hometown of Hingham. Even in his teenage years as a student at Boston College High School, he was nicknamed "Father Boyle" by his friends because of his active involvement at the local parish and his openness about his faith.

Fr. Boyle has stated that his captivation with the priesthood originated at a very young age, in the midst of a family tragedy. His younger brother passed away due to SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome) at only two months old. A group of kindhearted priests made the time and effort to visit with the family, taking time to talk with the children of the family and using games and puzzles to bring a little light to the dark situation that they were currently experiencing. Fr. Chris credits the priests as being a source of comfort during a painful and confusing time for his young self and his entire family. The experience stirred a desire in him to provide the same comfort and hope to others grieving and navigating times of tragedy.

While he was drawn to the priesthood from a young age, Fr. Boyle did not always share the same fondness for school. In his first homily addressing Arlington Catholic High School students, he spoke candidly about the fact that he didn't particularly enjoy school when he was a student. So when he felt God calling him to a vocation in teaching, which required him to both undergo further education and then to spend his days working in a school, it came as a surprise and required a lot of trust in God's plan. Later, when Fr. Boyle eventually felt called to once again change directions by pursuing a vocation in the priesthood, which required him to once again undergo even more years of education, he once again had to trust that God was pulling him toward something greater. After sharing this story, he encouraged students to listen for God's call in their lives and to place their trust in Him, even when what He's asking of them seems to go against their own plans and desires.



SAINT AGNES SCHOOL ASSOCIATE PRINCIPAL

WELCOME, DR. LAURIE A. SULLIVAN











Saint Agnes began the 2023-2024 school year with a new Associate Principal for PreK-Grade 8, Dr. Laurie A. Sullivan. The selection of Dr. Sullivan from a talented pool of candidates was a collaborative decision with input and participation from administrators, teachers, school chaplain, and parents.

The decision to bring Dr. Sullivan onto the Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School (SAS/ACHS) administrative team was due to her faithful dedication to the mission of Catholic education and her broad experience in the education field.

Over the nearly three decades that Dr. Sullivan has been an educator, she has served in a diverse range of roles in both Catholic and public schools, as well as a consultant with external organizations that provide resources for teachers and schools.

She most recently served at St. Patrick's School in Stoneham where she began as Assistant Principal before being promoted to Principal. During her time as Principal, Dr. Sullivan organized and supervised the New England Association of Schools and Colleges accreditation process; planned and implemented professional development on executive functional, instructional technology, and curriculum and instruction scaffolding; oversaw the religious program to include 8th Grade Confirmation, Adoration Thursdays,

Monthly Mass, Adult Parent Faith Formation; and reorganized the Parent Teacher Organization. She has also worked as an Educational Consultant with Teachers4Teachers since 2018, where she designs and implements workshops, teaches Structured English Immersion endorsed courses, and provides coaching to teachers.

Prior to that role, Dr. Sullivan worked as an Assistant Principal at both Newman Elementary School in Needham and Kingston Elementary School in Kingston, as a teacher/instructor at High Rock School/Pollard Middle School in Needham, and Simmons University in Boston. She has also held multiple positions as coordinator of professional development and of curriculum.

Dr. Sullivan's experience as an administrator, teacher, and parent of two sons makes her a natural fit for the SAS/ACHS Administration, and we are grateful for the addition of her experience, insight, and faith-filled leadership.

Dr. Sullivan says: "It has been a privilege to join the SAS/ACHS administrative team. I am so lucky to work with such an amazing group of educators whose integrity and professionalism is unparalleled. I smile each and every day coming to work because of SAS/ACHS families, the leadership, our parish, the teachers, the parents and especially our students. They are a true blessing."

EARLY LEARNING CENTER









Students have the ability to grow up on Medford Street with Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School (SAS/ACHS) all the way from infancy until their high school graduation, with the earliest stage of that journey beginning at the Saint Agnes Early Learning Center. Providing early childhood care and education from infancy through K0, the Early Learning Center is responsible for nurturing the youngest hearts and minds in the SAS/ACHS community.

The infants and toddlers entrusted to the care of the Saint Agnes Early Learning Center are in good hands with Director Amy Savoy, who can approach her role from the perspectives of both an experienced educator and a mother of three. Amy puts great emphasis on the collaborative relationship between staff and parents in order to best care for, nurture, and teach the young students at the Early Learning Center. She understands the anxiety experienced by parents and wants to ensure that they

can have confidence in the care and education their children are receiving at Saint Agnes School.

"The key to a successful early learning center is having the parents' trust and knowledge that we support them. This may be the first time these parents have left their children in someone else's care. They need to know their children are being loved and cared for," Savoy says.

In order to establish an environment of trust, support, and collaboration, all of the staff at the Saint Agnes Early Learning Center are in contact with parents throughout the day to both provide them reassurance and guarantee that they themselves are responding to the children's needs in the best way possible.

In terms of establishing an early learning curriculum, Amy's focus is on ensuring that children's growth is being nourished in all areas – including academically, emotionally, and spiritually.





SISTERS OF ST. JOSEPH OF BOSTON

What a year of celebrations for the Sisters of St. Joseph of Boston! The Bishop of Boston had heard about a wonderful teaching order in Flushing, New York. He wrote to the Bishop of Flushing inviting the sisters to come to Boston. Four Sisters of St. Joseph arrived at St. Thomas' Parish in Jamaica Plain and within four days opened a school of 200 girls. The rest is history. The Sisters of St. Joseph have continuously served at Saint Agnes and Arlington Catholic High School since 1888. The Congregation has had numerous gatherings and celebrations throughout the Archdiocese during this past year. The anniversary year of celebration concluded with a wonderful closing liturgy and reception at St. Agatha Parish in Milton in October.

The Pilot newspaper provided a lovely supplement in October highlighting the good works of the sisters as well as some of the history of the Congregation. Articles were submitted by sisters and associates. I was asked by my Congregation to write an article about the sisters' presence at Saint

Agnes School, Saint Agnes Parish, and Arlington Catholic High School. The School and parish honored me with a touching tribute for which I was most grateful.

On October 15, 2023, at our motherhouse in Brighton we had our annual jubilee celebration. Sisters were honored for 50, 55, 60, 65, 70, 75, and 80 years of service to the people of Boston and the "dear neighbor." We even have one sister, Sister Ann Marie Masone who celebrated 85 years in the Congregation. She is 103 years of age! Sister Cathy Clifford, former Principal of Arlington Catholic High School and a 60 year jubilarian, shared beautiful reflections during the Mass. Sister Cathy pointed out that among the jubilarians was a combined number of 2155 years of service to the good people of Boston and beyond. Indeed we are proud of our sisters, most especially the sisters who have served at Saint Agnes School and Arlington Catholic High School. May we ask your continued support as we move into uncharted waters into a future filled with joy and hope. God bless you all!

CAMP SUNSHINE VOLUNTEERING




Throughout the day, students had the opportunity to dive deeper into the subjects of each session in small group discussions.











